

## **2010 Fall Camporee FAQ**

Q1. What is the deposit amount and where do I turn in my payment?

A. The deposit amount depends on the number of scouts and scouters participating in the event. The calculation formula is on page 11 of the packet. Please turn these payments and pre-registrations into the council office.

Q2. Are the patrols expected to make it through all the stations?

A. The patrols do not have to make it through all the stations, but please encourage them to do so. They should be at each station long enough to have learned what is being taught at each station.

Q3. Will the camp have lots of wood for sale?

A. Yes. There is lots of dead and downed wood and branches from the summer storms that can also be used.

Q4. Do any other Districts have a traveling trophy?

A. As far as we know, Wakpaota is the only district with a traveling trophy. There is discussion taking place to add honorable mentions for the other districts. It is up to each district to decide if it wants to start a camporee traveling trophy for their district.

Q5. What sort of rakes are needed?

A. This will depend on the service project being done – leaf rakes are better for some projects while the heavier rakes works better for others. We are confident there will be a variety of different types brought along. Please be sure your rake is marked with your name and or troop number.

Q6. Is white gas permitted?

A. Yes

Q7. Do any other Districts have their own shelter at the park / campground?

A. Shelter 1 at the park will be for camporee headquarters. Hiawatha District Camping committee is using Shelter 3 to reach out to Hiawatha troops to help build the camporee experiences for the district.

Q8. I was disappointed to see the first 2 items in the general information. I would expect them to always be in effect.

A. Yes, they are always in effect. We wanted to reaffirm our commitment to the Scout Oath and Law and although we are all scouts/scouters and that is the expectation, there are some that need reminders.

Q9. Are we allowed to bring logs to build camp projects?

A. Yes. The recommendation is that lashing poles should be dry and stripped.

Q10. When do I need to wear my uniform?

A. Class A uniform (shirt, sash, neckerchief, etc.) should be worn for flag, chapel, and the campfire.

Comment: There is the possibility of media coverage. Please be sure your troop permissions are in order.
